There is no doubt that statutes, regulations, and caselaw are the bread and butter of most legal pleadings. But some cases and some legal issues require that you step outside your comfort zone. And the Guam Law Library has the resources to help with your legal research.

When you need an academic perspective on a legal issue, or perhaps historical information about a statute or regulation, take a look at the resources that HeinOnline has to offer.

HeinOnline is available from all the library's computers. Just ask for the user login and password at the service desk.



Maybe you're new to HeinOnline? Maybe you've never even heard of this online resource? No problem! We have handouts to guide your use of HeinOnline. Or you can prepare for the library experience by watching training videos from your office before you walk into the library. Just visit the HeinOnline [Help and Support](#) page to see all the videos offered.

Each video is self-guided, so you can view them at your own

pace. And they're absolutely free of charge.

Hein Online's Law Journal Library offers comprehensive coverage of more than 1,700 law and law-related periodicals. You can browse by journal titles or subject, or conduct more precise research with a "field search" using the article's text, title or author. If you have the Bluebook citation, you can use the Citation Navigator to find it quickly and easily.

Nunez-Moron v. Holder,
No. 11-2317, 2012 U.S.
App. LEXIS 22358 (7th Cir.
Oct. 30, 2012)


An alien who illegally re-enters after having been previously ordered removed is ineligible for adjustment of status. An alien's expedited removal will sever the alien's requisite physical

presence for purposes of cancellation of eligibility.

United States v. Koevi,
698 F.3d 126 (3d Cir.
Oct. 24, 2012)
18 U.S.C. §1546(a)
criminalizes not only the use of a forged or fraudulent visa but also the use of authentic immigration documents

procured by fraud.

Bedoya-Melendez v. U.S. Att'y Gen., 699 F.3d 1270 (11th Cir. 2012)
Under 8 U.S.C. §1252(a)(2)(B), there is no judicial review of the statutory eligibility criterion of "battered or subject to extreme cruelty" for cancellation of removal.

The Guam Law Library has more than 50 different CLE courses, available free of charge, to judges, active and inactive Guam Bar Assn. members, and local


court and federal court attorneys and law clerks.

added more than 30 new courses since February 2012. Many of our newer courses give ethics and professional responsibility credit.

Eligible patrons can borrow up to five (5) items for three (3) calendar days, from January to November (special rules apply in December only).

We are proud to offer our patrons a variety of CLE courses in substantive law and to help them in their law practice.



Our newer CLE acquisitions

➤ **Digital Evidence and Search Warrants for Electronic Evidence (1.5 hour CLE)**

This session covers what every lawyer should know about search and seizure of electronic media devices (computers, cell phones, PDAs, etc), federal privacy statutes governing digital information in possession of service providers, and how to admit electronic evidence in court.

➤ **Evidence Tricks and Traps for the Civil Practitioner (1 hour CLE)**

Many lawsuits rise and fall on the admissibility of evidence. Learn the tricks of the trade -- and some traps for the unwary -- from two experienced civil trial attorneys.

➤ **Life Insurance Planning in Today's Environment (1 hour CLE)**

Learn when and how to use life insurance to help achieve your client's estate planning goals. Take away planning tips, and learn about the tax and other compliance issues associated with these trusts.

➤ **The Taxation of Judgments and Settlements (1 hour CLE)**

In 1996, Congress amended Internal Revenue Code Section 104(a)(2) to exclude from gross income any damages received on account of a "personal physical injury." This panel will discuss the current state of the law, as well as provide practical tax advice, including guidance regarding information reporting (W-2 and 1099) in the context of employment related cases.

Power Searching with Google

The people behind Google know their stuff. So it should come as no surprise that Google now offers [videos and training sessions](#) to help its users become better searchers.

[Power Searching](#) is a free, self-paced course made up of six classes, with each class consisting of few 4-7 minute lessons, followed by activities to let you practice, and an exercise so you can test your newly acquired skills.

These are all self-paced videos, so you can take your time with each class and lesson, and even repeat them.

- The classes are: Introduction- How Google works,
- Interpreting results,
- Advanced techniques,
