Established pursuant to 9 GCA §9201 *et seq.*, as a tax-exempt non-profit educational corporation, the library is the largest and most complete legal research center on Guam, and its collection includes federal statutory materials, legal encyclopedias and treatises, periodicals, and legal resources from our Pacific Island neighbors.

The library is governed by an appointed **Board of Trustees**.
